The Korean War & Asian/American Culture

This course offers a transnational cultural history of the Korean War, unspooling its multiple threads in order to come to terms with the way it shaped—and continues to shape—the US’s sense of its self, its place in the world, and the heartland of Korean America. Students will consider the war as a series of unwieldy discourses – including containment, de/militarization, desegregation, brainwashing, impersonation, red-baiting, and “han” --- whose ghostly legacies whisper inconvenient truths about the triangulated relations among US empire, the US nation-state, and Korean America.
